Beeliar Primary school is a level 5 school with 430 students. We cater for students from Kindergarten to Year Six, offering specialist subjects in Physical Education, Music, Art, LOTE (Noongar) and Health. We share a site with Fremantle Language Development Centre and we belong to the Cockburn Central Education Network (CCEN).

Governance

- Ensure all children's needs are met through differentiation and Individual Education Plans where necessary
- Continue to develop and expand our Sustainability Plan across the school and community



Teaching Quality

Goal: Leaders are providing the conditions for quality teaching to occur in every classroom. Staff demonstrate a commitment to their core business of teaching and learning and a collective responsibility for promoting continuous professional improvement.

What we will do:

- High expectations and standards of teacher performance through Professional learning and Performance Development based on the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers
- Embed and continue literacy practices and programs Review learning data targets each term including Pre-Lit, InitiaLit, Spelling Mastery, Critical Reading and the Beeliar Writing Model
- Embed and continue Numeracy practices and programs including PRIME and Problem Solving
- Continue Daily Reviews in Literacy and Numeracy across the school
- Embed the Beeliar Instructional Model of Teach, Practise and Apply, including Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI) and High Impact Teaching Strategies (HITS)
- Provide specialists learning areas of Performing Art, Visual Art, Physical Education, Health and Language Other Than English (Noongar)
- Support staff to deliver STEM across the curriculum
- Provide a guaranteed and viable curriculum through our Beeliar Scope and Sequences and policies
- Provide ongoing Professional Learning through Power Hour

Early Childhood Education:

- Maintain the National Quality Standards to drive continuous improvement in our Kindergarten to Year 2 Programs.
- WA Kindergarten Curriculum is implemented in conjunction with the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) to enhance learning
- Continue to explore and clarify the school's Early Childhood philosophy for teaching and learning

Student Achievement and Progress

Goal: The school is on a journey to become more data informed and to build the capacity of all staff to understand and use data to plan for student learning

What we will do:

- Continue the practice of tracking student progress and intervening or extending as appropriate
- Continue to build staff data literacy, analysis and reflection through engagement with Ed Companion and Best Performance
- Collect reading, spelling, numeracy and science data pre and post through PAT testing
- Use Bright Path to monitor and set targets for writing
- Interrogate NAPLAN and On Entry for lines of inquiry and gap analysis
- Administer SOCS (Speech Assessment) in Kindergarten to monitor progress

Use of Resources

Goal: The school's approach to the management of its budget has been measured, thoughtful and innovative, with a clear commitment to building staff capacity to improve student learning.

- The Principal and Manager Corporate Services to continue to engage in ongoing Professional Learning.
- Allocate Instructional Coaches across phase levels
- Align budget to support school improvement targets
- Ensure rigorous and transparent accountability practices at classroom and school level

Targets Academic

- Percentage of students in bottom 20% in Numeracy and Literacy to be similar to or less than Like Schools
- Percentage of students in top 20% in Numeracy and Literacy to be similar to or better than Like Schools
- Achieve green boxes in year 3 and 5 NAPLAN (achieving one standard deviation above the Australian norm)
- Achievement of Pre-Primary On Entry data to be better than like schools
- The results in the ACER Performance Attainment Tests in mathematics and reading are similar to or above the norm and have an effect size of 0.8 or above

Attendance

- The regular attendance rate of all students will be similar to or better than WA Public Schools.
- The percentage of authorised absences will be 75% or above.

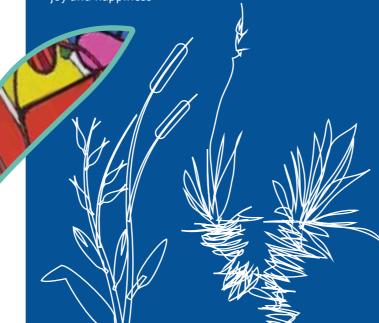
